

It's important to make sure you have all the medicines you may require ahead of bank holiday closures. Make sure to order your repeat prescription in enough time.
Please remember you can request your medication by using the NHS Wales app.

A properly stocked medicine cabinet can help you to treat many common illnesses and ailments over the festive period.

The following items can be helpful.

- A first-aid kit, including bandages, plasters, a thermometer, antiseptic and eyewash solution
- Pain relief such as aspirin, paracetamol, and ibuprofen
- Oral rehydration salts
- Anti-diarrhoea tablets to relieve symptoms of diarrhoea, these will not help with the underlying cause
- Antihistamines which can help with allergies
- Indigestion relief remedies

When the surgery is closed for the bank holidays, medical advice and urgent support can be accessed by telephoning 111.

For minor illnesses such as headaches, colds, and diarrhoea, speaking with the pharmacist should be your first port of call. We advise you check bank holiday opening times before visiting.

Minor injuries such as bites, burns, sprains, or fractures can be treated at a minor injuries' unit.

In a medical emergency such as choking, blacking out, chest pain and serious blood loss call 999 or attend A&E.
